MEET OUR NEW ASSOCIATE PASTOR! Joining us in July 2019

Rev. Kelly L. Grimes was born and raised in Atlanta, Georgia. She is a 2003 graduate of Georgia State University with a Bachelor's Degree in Religious Studies. During her time in Atlanta, she served as the chaplain assistant at Clark Atlanta University where she started a university-wide Bible study. She also served as a youth pastor at Central UMC.



In May 2009, she graduated from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC with a Master of Divinity degree. During seminary, she served as the Youth Minister at Asbury UMC in Washington, DC. While there, she served as the Vice President of Student Council and on the Student Board of the Washington Theological Consortium.

Rev. Grimes became the Associate Pastor at Westminster United Methodist Church in Westminster, MD in August 2009. During her time at Westminster UMC, she led confirmation classes, participated in hospital/home visitations, and taught church-wide Bible study. She was very active in community activities in Westminster and Carroll County.

Rev. Grimes was appointed as the Associate Pastor to the Epworth United Methodist Chapel in Baltimore County in 2011. In May 2014, Rev. Grimes, by the grace of God, became an Elder in Full Connection in the Baltimore-Washington Conference of the United Methodist Church.

In 2017, she was appointed as the Senior Pastor of the Mt. Zion UMC in Baltimore, MD. Currently, Rev. Grimes serves on the district superintendency committee and the Baltimore Metropolitan District Committee on Ministry as the registrar. Her love of God and God's people, sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ in the community and in the world continues to be her passion!

In her spare time, Rev. Grimes loves to play tennis, is an avid runner and enjoys traveling. She is also a proud active member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., an international service sorority.
