Today we are celebrating the baptism of Jesus, and we are remembering our baptism when God affirmed our truest identity as God's children and enfolded us in a lifelong covenant. Many Voices: We will remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world.

One Voice: Will you receive and profess the Christian faith as contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

Many Voices: We affirm and teach the faith of the whole church as we put our trust in God Almighty, in Jesus Christ, his only Son, and in the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever.

For those gathering in person, please follow the direction of our ushers. For those joining in worship from afar, you are invited to touch water to your forehead as you remember your baptism.


